


Welcome to the final MCBC newsletter of the 2023/24 year! For more info and regular updates follow our Instagram @biglegsmansfield (o)

SUMMER VIIIS

This year, many colleges, including Mansfield, came into Trinity term with relatively new crews owing to the flooding for the previous two terms. Our second boats were comprised almost entirely of new rowers, as were some seats in our top boats – a testament to the club's goal of making rowing accessible to everyone.

The W1 had a fun week, finishing up +2 with 2 speedy bumps before Donnington bridge and 2 row overs. The lineup in the boat changed every day following an unfortunate bike accident on the first day. However, this last minute change up didn't stop them, bumping Trinity on day 1 and St Catz on day 3.

The O1 probably rowed further than any crew during summer VIIIs with a row over every day, coming within feet of John's on the first two days and then near to Brasenose on the second two. Although they never caught Brasenose or Johns this year, spirits remained high in the crew, and everything was put on the table - a testament to the hard work put in this year to retain the place at the top of division three.

The W2 managed to experience just about everything summer VIIIs had to offer this year. The crew was almost all comprised of novices, and unperturbed by the stacked Reuben 1st boat behind bumping them on day 1, they had a speedy week with a well deserved bump on St Anthony's on day 2, a row over on day 3, and bumped by Merton on day 4.

The O2 approached their bungline in division 6 with the mindset that making it to the starting gun was a success, with a boat full of new rowers this year (and this term), but defied all expectations with a bump off the start line on the final day. This (as OURCS were keen to point out on the tannoy) was the first bump for the Mansfield O2 in Summer VIIIs in 20 starts! Despite a poor year for weather leading to tricky conditions to learn to row, the results of this boat show what can be achieved with the right mindset.

VIIIS DINNER


